

Arizona State Lottery Regulatory Agenda for 2022

As required by A.R.S. § 41-1021.02 the following is the regulatory agenda for the Arizona State Lottery. The Lottery may undertake a rulemaking even if the rulemaking is not included on the annual regulatory agenda. I. Rulemakings Expected to Be Underway in 2022

The Arizona Lottery does not receive any federal funding for rulemaking activities.

Note that the Arizona Lottery will not proceed with any rulemaking until an exemption from EO #2021-02 (or subsequent applicable order) is granted.
